



“Curbside Recycling for K.C.K.”

WHEN: Place your green recycling bin out by 7 a.m. on the same day as your trash day each week.

HOW: Residents must have a green recycling bin in order to participate in curbside recycling. For bin pick up locations call 311 or go to the U.G. website www.wycokck.org and go to the Public Works Department page.

WHO: Homes, up to a four-plex, who receive residential trash service from Deffenbaugh in K.C. Ks. shall have curbside recycling services available to them. This is not for apartments, trailer courts, or businesses.

WHAT: We will be picking up paper, paperboard, plastic containers, aluminum and steel cans, and corrugated cardboard. Place all your recyclables in your recycling bin and place the bin to the curb weekly on your regularly scheduled trash day by 7 am. Place recycling bin 5-6 feet from your trash.

“YES”

Paper: Examples of paper that will be picked up will be newspapers (including inserts and ads), office paper, junk mail, magazines, catalogues, and phone books. Put paper in your recycling bin. Try and place heavier items on top of loose paper so it does not blow out of your bin.

Paperboard: Paperboard refers to the packaging material used to make cereal, cracker, beverage, shoe boxes, etc. Breakdown your paperboard and place paperboard in your recycling bin.

Plastic #1 thru #7: Deffenbaugh has expanded its pickup to include an assortment of #1-#7 plastic containers. Even though they have expanded to #1-#7 not all plastics can be recycled. See further explanation for plastics on the document entitled: “Expansion of Plastic for Curbside Recycling”.

Aluminum & Steel Cans: Place empty beverage aluminum cans in the bin. Empty soup, fruit, vegetable, food, and beverage steel cans are also accepted. Rinse out and if possible crush prior to putting them into your bin.

Cardboard: Corrugated cardboard refers to shipping boxes that have the “wavy middle layer”. Boxes should be flattened & placed in bin or cut to pieces of 2 feet by 2 feet, tied together & put on ground under or near the bin. You can also fold and stuff multiple boxes into one box and set next to the recycling bin.

“NO” No glass (take to Recycling Center); no shredded paper; no carry out pizza boxes; no books; no egg cartons. (For plastics not taken see the document “Expansion of Plastic for Curbside Recycling”)
