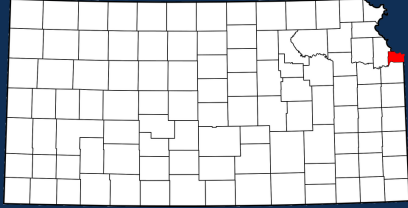
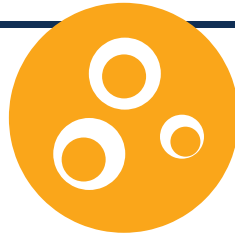


SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS in Wyandotte County, KS in 2018

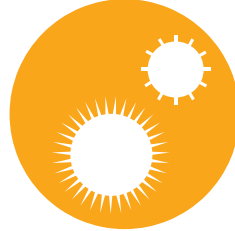


THE COUNTY HAS EXPERIENCED STEEP AND SUSTAINED STI INCREASES



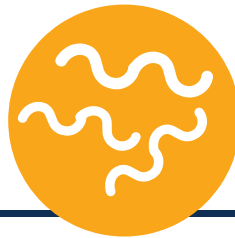

Wyandotte County, Kansas continues to see steep and sustained increases in chlamydia, gonorrhea, and syphilis. Sexually transmitted infection rates in Wyandotte County remain higher than the rest of the state and surrounding counties. These rising rates are a significant public health concern.
