Join us for this free fantastic annual event to celebrate the American Bald Eagle as well as all birds of prey! This family-friendly event has something for all ages. The event will take place simultaneously at JP Davis Hall as well as the FL Schlagle Library at Wyandotte County Lake, so be sure to visit both sites. Operation Wildlife will give numerous presentations on the live birds of prey on exhibit through out the day at both locations. Birds on exhibit may include a Bald Eagle, owls, hawks, falcons and even a crow and a turkey vulture. At the library, we will also have a children's craft area, binocular check out as well as a spotting scope station to view the migrating birds that visit WyCo Lake in winter.

2017 Christmas Tree Recycling Locations

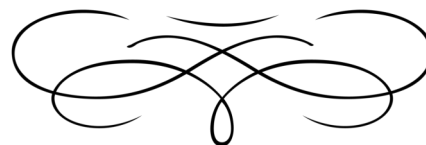
Residents of Wyandotte County can drop off their Christmas tree for recycling December 26, 2017 through January 31, 2018. All tinsel, lights and ornaments must be removed. All drop off locations will be clearly marked with a sign.

Please drop off Christmas trees in the following designated areas only.

- **Stony Point Park** - 527 N. 86th (North East corner of parking lot)
- **Alvey Park** - 4834 Metropolitan (North side of the South parking lot)
- **City Park** - 2601 Park Drive (In the park around the corner on the grass)
- **Wyandotte County Park** (Bonner Park) - 631 N 126th (Ball field parking)
