Citizens Planning Committee Citizen's Survey of Life in Wyandotte County - Summary

The Citizens Planning Committee (CPC) is a group of volunteers interested in the well-being of Wyandotte County. The CPC, which is part of the Wyandotte County Economic Development Council, has undertaken a survey with the objective of identifying priorities for the County to focus on over the next five years.

A total of 2,273 surveys were sent to randomly selected Wyandotte County households on September 5, 2000. A total of 447 surveys were undeliverable do either to unknown or vacant addresses. The total number of surveys returned was 506. Adjusting the total number sent by the undeliverables, the response rate for the survey was 27.7%. With this response rate, and the fact this was a random survey, we can be confident that the results of the survey reflect the thoughts of County residents overall.

The survey asked questions regarding life in general in Wyandotte County¹. This summary will provide some general survey observations below. Also accompanying the statements are several tables which show the results of the survey questions Finally, a copy of the survey is attached as a reference in Appendix A.

- Education received the highest overall score² of 3.00. The lowest scores were identified by residents to be Shopping (1.80), Arts & Culture (2.12), and Personal Safety (2.33). (Table 1)
- Shopping received an index score³ of 43.9 indicating respondents felt, more than other categories, that shopping is "getting worse" in the County Likewise, education was deemed as "getting better" more that other categories with an index score of 105.4. (Table 2)
- "Public safety, security, and crime" was chosen most frequently by respondents as the top priority for the County over the next five years. This category was followed by "shopping & retail business" and "youth & schools" as priorities to be focused on. (Table 3)
- Ten percent of respondents are aware of the County's strategic plan. (Table 4)

¹ After staff review, it was decided to exclude responses from the third survey question in this summary. The staff concluded that the responses to this question were somewhat ambiguous, and therefore the responses could not be clearly interpreted. This particular question asked respondents to "agree or disagree" with a series of statements pertaining to the improvement of various conditions in Wyandotte County. A "disagree" response could reflect either a "no change in the condition" or a decline in the condition. If this question is posed in a future survey, a more detailed scaling of responses is needed

²The score is the mean of responses with 1 = "poor" or "lowest" and 5 = "excellent" or "highest".

³The index is computed be taking 100, plus the percent expecting conditions to improve, minus the percent expecting things to get worse. An index of 100 means that most respondents feel the category is staying the same. Less than 100, overall, the category is worsening or over 100 getting better
