**a) FY24/25 Comprehensive Grant & Reinvestment-Bonnie Mejia**

**Bonnie:** Presented the FY24/25 Comprehensive Plan Grant & FY 24/25 Reinvestment Grant to the board members. (Please see attached grant.)

**Phill:** Phil clarified why the outcome is at 42% is bad. When the Senate Bill 367 was implemented along with other changes, we no longer received low risk youth just medium high-risk to high-risk youth on probation. These youth are the ones that are more likely to cause problems too themselves and others and committee new offenses. When we had the low to high-risk youth, we had 75 – 80 youth on probation. Now that we only get the medium high to high-risk, we have much less youth on probation. We have 25 youth that are in the Correctional Facility. The percent is really not bad, yet we can do better.

**Bonnie:** Also, the bill passed shorter probation terms. We have 6 to 12 months' probation terms. Working with the medium to high-risk youth, there are barriers such as mental health, substance abuse, trauma that must be addressed with the youth. Most likely our youth is not enrolled in school or employed. By the time we get them on tract their probation period is over and they are released and this makes it very difficult to complete all the court orders that were ordered.

**Mindy:** Can you address the two fatalities of our youth that died under our supervision?

**Bonnie:** One youth who was on house arrest left his residence and was killed while at a gun sale. The second youth overdosed on Narcan.

Our staff has been trained to carry Narcan when transporting youth in case of an emergency. We have been discussing and informing parents how to use Narcan in the event their youth may overdose.
