2020 BUDGET - See attached for additional detail

Debbie Jonscher of the Unified Government Finance Department provided information projecting for the 2020 Budget at 5.75% growth rate for existing real estate and utilities. Personal property assumes a 5% decline due to legislation passed in 2010 making the relative value of the new assets in this category taxed a lower rate.

Property Tax Revenue Estimate – Factored in worst case scenario for Hollywood Casino lost appeal payments. Also, built in a 3.00% delinquency rate.

Reginald Lindsey, Budget Manager of the Unified Government shared an overview of the County Library fund statement of Reviews and Expenditures 2016-2020 providing two scenarios reflecting a 3% expenditure increase and a 5% expenditure increase for the library fund and allocations. It's recommended to have a 20% fund balance. *See attachment for detailed information.*
