The Consolidated General Fund is the largest fund the U.G. has. It holds all funds not required by law to be held in a different fund. Funds within the Consolidated General are the City General, County General, and Parks and Recreation Funds.


City General Fund

County General Fund


This pie chart shows the County General Fund broken down by service area.

This pie chart shows the services provided by the Parks Fund within the Consolidated General Fund






The City and County General Funds are separated by their revenue sources and what services they provide. For example, the KCK Fire Department covers the City, while the Sheriff covers the County. Parks and Recreation is included in the Consolidated General Fund because its services overlap the city and county.
